# Upcoming nomination and balloting process announced

The 7 17 Credit Union 2019 election, nomination, and balloting process for the Board of Directors will soon be under way. There will be two positions up for re-election, each for a three-year term. Election of the Directors and any other items that require a membership vote are handled through the mail, giving every member equal opportunity to vote.

In the event of a contested election, ballots will be sent to the membership with the December 2018 account statements that should be received on or around January 10, 2019. The ballot results will be announced at the Annual Meeting in April 2019.

Jack Wilster, Board Chairman, and Cheryl DiGiacobbe, Secretary/Treasurer, have been appointed to the 2019 election Nominating Committee. All candidate nominations for the Board of Directors positions must be made by the nominating committee prior to the ballot mailing. Candidates should be aware that the Board of Directors positions require a considerable amount of volunteer time. Members interested in being considered as a volunteer by the committee should send a letter outlining their intent to run, if nominated, and serve, if elected, along with a resume to:

### **Ground broken for new branches**

7 17 Credit Union broke ground for its Canfield branch on Tuesday, June 19. The Canfield branch, located at 4280 Boardman-Canfield Road, is the 13th branch for the Credit Union, the fourth in Mahoning County.

The new, full-service, state-of-the-art office will offer lobby and drive-thru services as well as ATM access.

A groundbreaking was also held for the new Larchmont Avenue branch on Wednesday, June 27. The new branch is being constructed on property adfacent to the current Larchmont branch, which will be used in the future as expanded space for back-office operations.

Both locations are anticipated to be complete in spring 2019.
